All schools receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil for pupils in years 1-6. Sports Premium Allocation

The Association for Physical Education suggests that possible uses for the funding include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE.
- New or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/Sport.
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/Sport.
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games.
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/Sport.

At Yorkley Primary School we have been running a programme of professional development in PE for teachers, whereby staff are given the opportunity to observe and team teach with PE specialists. This year we have continued to employ a sports teacher who is sharing his expertise and passion side by side with the teachers and pupils.

The Sports funding has enabled us to sign up to the Youth Sports Trust, which provides us with even more professional development opportunities through courses, support and expertise from specialist PE teachers.

Funding for 2015-2016 allowed us to continue to offer children in KS1 and KS2 free after school clubs that was run by our external P.E teacher and staff within the school. Depending on the activity, these clubs were open to all our children to develop skills that have been taught in their P.E lessons. The clubs were timetabled to coincide with competitions that were organized by the School Games Organiser and local strategic partners such as Hockey, Netball and Tennis Clubs.

As a result of these clubs the school entered the following competitions: Key Steps Gymnastics; Forest of Dean Cross Country championships; Forest Centenary Football league; Forest South Tag Rugby Tournament; Forest South Netball Tournament; Lydney Hockey Club Quiksticks Hockey competition; Forest South Archery competition; Forest South Quadkids competition for Y3/4; Lydney Tennis Club Y5/6 mini orange competition; Forest South mini-red competition for Y3/4; Forest South Pentathlon Challenge; Forest South Indoor Athletics competition; Forest South Rounders competition; Forest South Swimming Gala: Forest of Dean Country Dancing Festival; Gloucestershire Dance Festival at the Everyman Theatre in Cheltenham.

Having attended the Level 1 events the school progressed to Level 2 events in Key Steps Gymnastics, Archery and Cross Country and were joint winners of the Swimming Gala.

For the first time the school qualified for the Level 3 County School Games at Hartpury in Archery and Tennis. The school has forged links with Hartpury College and hosts work experience students from their Sports Coaching Course for 10 weeks.

Following on from receiving the YST Bronze Award, the school are confident to achieve the Silver Award this year.
