Sports Premium

In March 2013, the government announced that it was to provide additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools in England – The Primary PE and sports Premium. This has recently been extended until 2020.

From 2013 – 2016 All schools received a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil for pupils in years 1-6. This amount increased in 2017 to £16,000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil.

With this funding our aim is to encourage our children to try something new, something that we have not offered before or something that may not necessarily have been available to them. By providing these opportunities we hope that they will develop a lifelong love of PE and Sport and lead active lifestyles well into adulthood. We want the experiences to be positive, fun and fulfilling and we look forward to the promise that this funding will bring.

The 2016 – 2017 Sports Premium for Yorkley Primary School was £8580
The predicted allocation for 2017 – 2018 is £17,120

Sports Premium Allocation

The Association for Physical Education suggests that possible uses for the funding include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE.
- New or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/Sport.
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/Sport.
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games.
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/Sport.

At Yorkley Primary School we have been running a programme of professional development in PE for teachers, whereby staff are given the opportunity to observe and team teach with PE specialists. This year we have continued to employ a sports teacher who is sharing his expertise and passion side by side with the teachers and pupils.

The Sports funding has enabled us to sign up to the Youth Sports Trust, which provides us with even more professional development opportunities through courses, support and expertise from specialist PE teachers.

Funding for 2016-2017 allowed us to continue to offer children in KS1 and KS2 free after school clubs that were run by our external PE teacher and staff within the school. Depending on the activity, these clubs were open to all our children to develop skills that have been taught in their PE lessons. The clubs were timetabled to coincide with competitions that were organized by the School Games Organiser and local strategic partners such as Hockey, Netball and Tennis Clubs.

As a result of these clubs the school entered the following competitions: Forest of Dean Cross Country championships; Forest South Archery competition; Forest South Quadkids competition for Y3/4; Forest South mini-red competition for Y3/4; Forest South Pentathlon Challenge; Forest South Indoor Athletics competition; Forest South Rounders competition; Forest South Swimming Gala; Forest of Dean Country Dancing Festival; Gloucestershire Dance Festival at the Everyman Theatre in Cheltenham.

Having attended the Level 1 events the school progressed to Level 2 events in Key Step Gymnastics, Cross Country and Panathlon Challenge. The school won Gold at the Swimming Gala.

The school qualified for the Level 3 county key steps 3/4 gymnastics competition and qualified for the County Plate Panathlon challenge in Stroud. 2 children (1 boy and 1 girl) qualified for the cross country championships.

'Valuing Learning, Learning to Value'

The school has strong links with Hartpury College by hosting work experience students for 10 weeks from their Sports Coaching course.

Following on from receiving the YST Silver Award in 2015/16, the school was awarded Silver again in 2016/2017.

Sports Funding 2017 – 2018

- To continue to provide specialist sports teacher to develop sporting skills, active lifestyles and interventions where needed.
- Increase pupil participation for SEN and Pupil Premium children in competitions, interschool sport and events.
- To provide further opportunity for children to excel in a wider range of competitions.
- To train young leaders ready for a lunchtime programme whereby pupils are equipped to be healthy, thoughtful, caring and active citizens in school and in wider society.
- Set up a sport ability programme in school to link to the 'nurture' programme.
- Provide awareness of creative sports by setting up dance and/or gymnastics club.
- Improve self-esteem and physical skills by introducing martial arts in lessons or by working with the mini marines.
