# **Armistice Day:**

A small group of year 5/6 pupils have been working on a project linked to The Armistice and WW2 with Mrs. Phillips. They started the project by visiting Rodley House Residential Home for the Elderly. Here they interviewed some of the residents about their memories either as children growing up in the war or of serving in one of the armed forces. One of the residents served in the Navy on the North

Atlantic Convoys and he was able to talk about his experiences. Another resident grew up on a farm between Yorkley and Lydney and remembers Italian prisoners of war being on the farm and working on their farm. She also remembered a parachute coming down and

the mad race of locals to cut up the parachute so they would have silk to make articles of clothing!

The project will culminate in a Remembrance Assembly on Monday 12th November, organised and run by this group. We will be welcoming a visitor, Andrew Morgan, a serving member of the RAF.

At the end, the group of girls will take and lay a Wreath at the War Memorial in Yorkley.
